University of Arkansas Community College at Rich Mountain (UA Rich Mountain) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) degree from the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the bachelor’s degree requirements at UA Rich Mountain by completing an Associate of Applied Science in a technical area at UA Rich Mountain. Completed UA Rich Mountain courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the BAS degree requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. UAFS will offer the remaining BAS degree requirements through online courses. Per this Agreement, UAFS will transfer 75 hours of lower division coursework for the BAS.

Note: Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.
